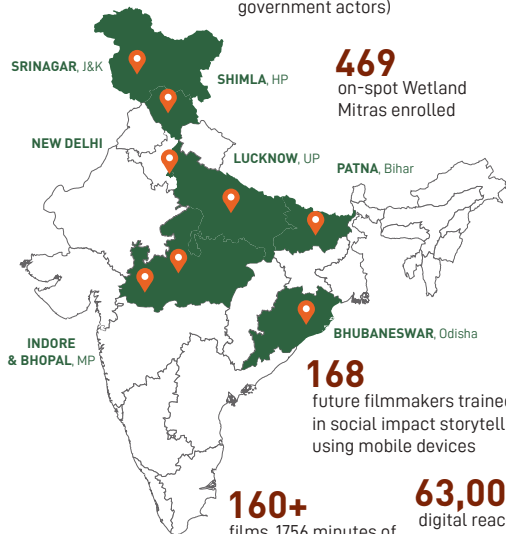

MEDIA ENGAGEMENT PROGRAMME

The **Wetlands for LiFE Media Engagement Programme** is divided into **consultations for media professionals, and future journalist workshops** for postgraduate students of journalism and mass communication. This initiative is designed to enhance the role of media in wetland conservation. By focusing on the critical themes of **wetland ecology** and **environmental journalism**, the programme equips participants with the knowledge and skills necessary for accurate reporting on these vital ecosystems. Sessions addressing the challenges and threats to wetlands, alongside storytelling techniques, empower journalists to stimulate proactive initiatives that mainstream wetlands in their coverage. This collaborative effort not only fosters a deeper understanding of wetland issues but also encourages media personnel to advocate for urgent action and informed public discourse, ultimately contributing to the sustainable management of these essential natural resources.
